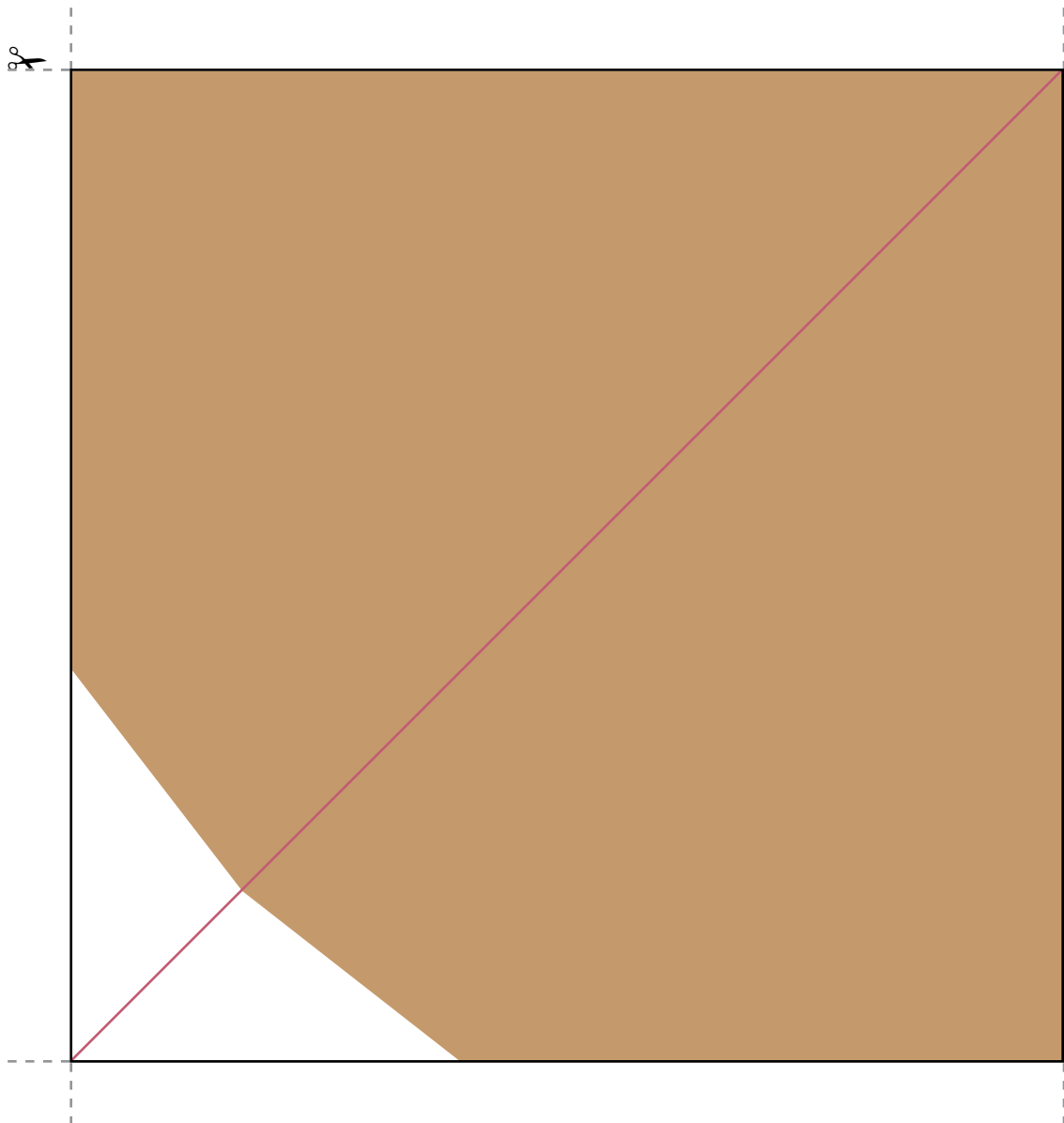
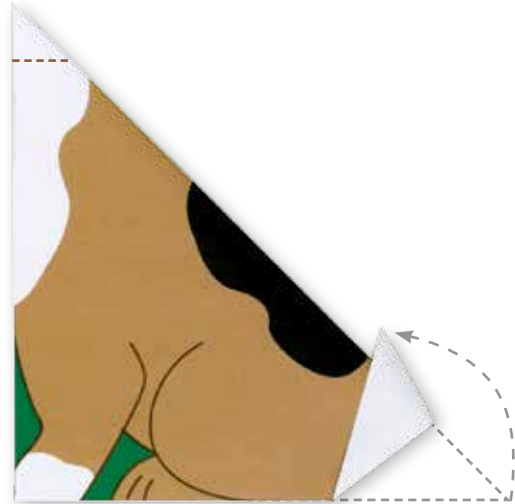


1. Cut out the two squares along the solid black lines.
2. Place the body square with the brown side facing up. Fold in along the red line so you see the body pattern.
3. Fold and then unfold along the blue line in the corner of the triangle. Turn the triangle over, and fold and unfold along the blue line again.
4. Put one hand inside the triangle to open it. Gently fold up the corner along the creases you made in step 3 so the white side—the tail—shows. The body is done.

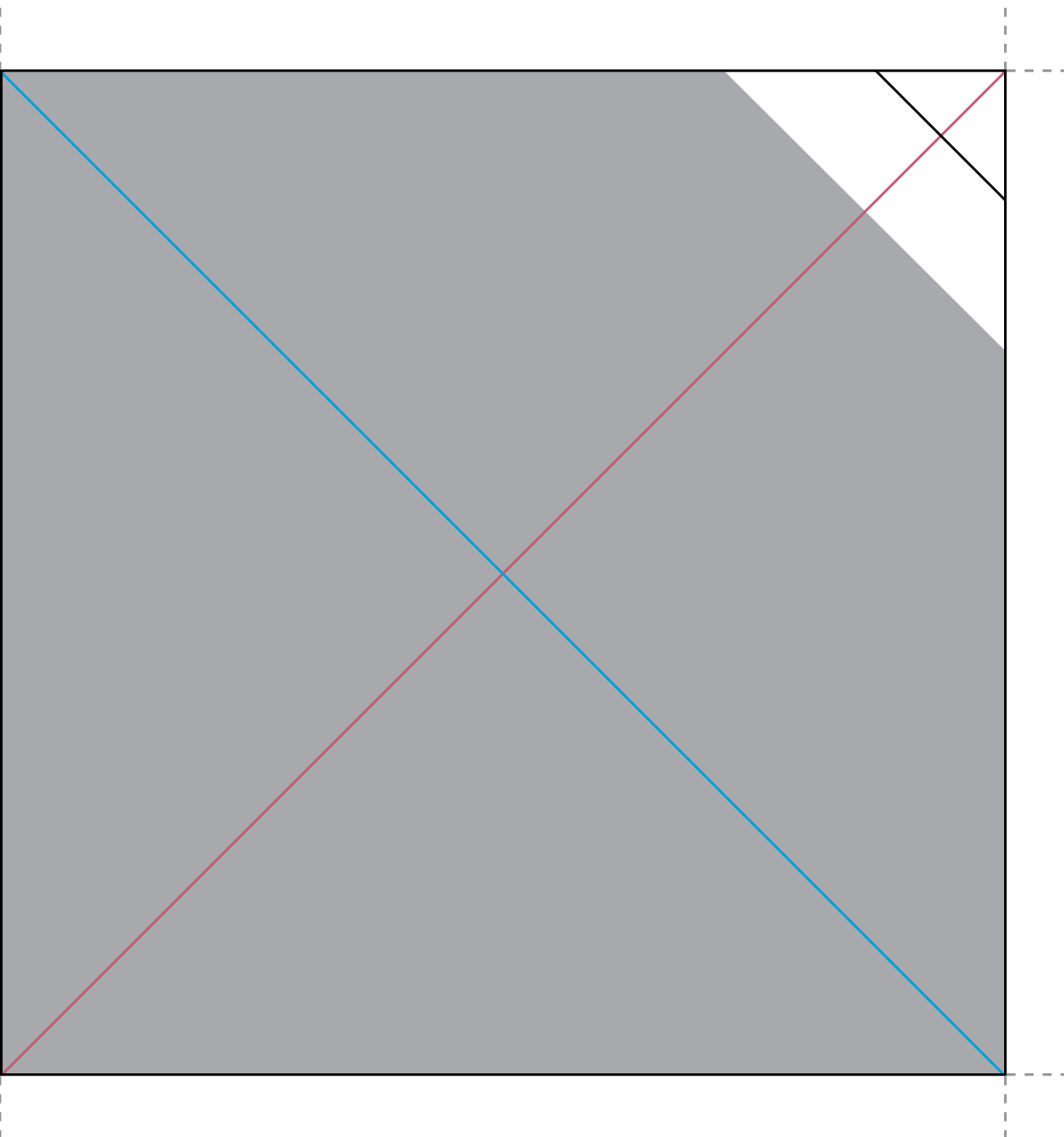


**5.** Place the head square with the gray side facing up. Fold in along the red line and then unfold. Now fold in along the blue line so you see the dog's face.

**6.** To make the nose, fold both layers up along the blue line and then unfold. Fold the bottom layer along the crease to tuck it inside the triangle. Fold the top layer back up and then fold down the black tip along the black line.

**7.** To make the ears, fold in along the blue lines.

**8.** Place the dog's head on its body. If the head wobbles too much, fold the top tip of the body down along the brown dashed line.



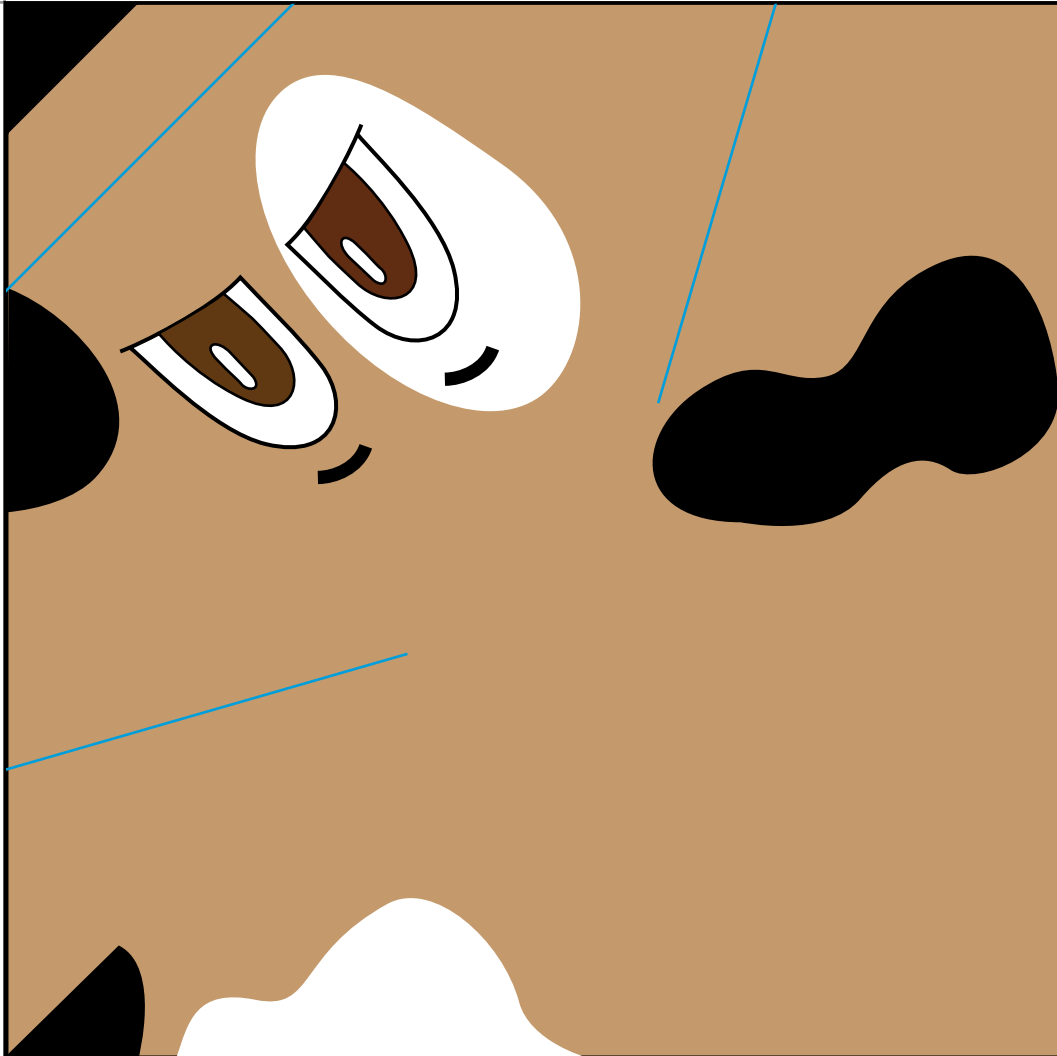
# PUP PET
